# **Reading Rocks at Ryefield!**

You may have seen your child reading from what, at first glance, appears to be a shopping receipt but is in fact a short story! We are proud that we are the **ONLY** school in the UK to have the Short Edition Story Dispenser. Your child has the option of choosing a randomly selected story which takes them 1, 3 or 5 minutes to read.

The response was amazing and although we have only had the machine with us for a week we have racked up an amazing 686 stories dispensed, this equates to 2472 minutes of reading time - or 41 hours!!!

If you have unpaid fees for lunch - please ensure that your account is settled. Your child will not receive a school lunch until their sQuid account has credit!


# If sQuid does not allow you to order due to owed funds then it is your responsibility to provide your child(ren) a packed lunch.
