#### Message from Steve Hedley, CEO - Trinity

Like a lot of people I have spoken to since Saturday morning, when I woke up and saw the rain my first thought was that I could go home. My second thought was for thousands of people without a home. They will be wet all day and have to sleep in a wet sleeping bag tonight, risk their health deteriorating, risk being a victim of crime, violence, abuse and then do it all again.

We must stop this cycle of harm - we must do more.

In the next few weeks we hope to open a winter night shelter to help 16 people off the streets by the end of February. We are working on opening permanent emergency accommodation that will house 60 people by this time next year and we have plans to open another 20 houses that will provide supported housing to a further 100 people, housing a total of 350 people in the next 12 months.

To help achieve this we are still reliant this year on income from The Big SleepOut, so please please continue to raise sponsorship.


Your £250 of sponsorship provides a room for someone sleeping rough for a week, so please don't stop just because the event is over...
