Mid Year Reports

Hopefully parents of children in KS1 and KS2 (Years 1 to Year 6) will be in the process of receiving a mid year report. The sheet provides you with valuable information about your child's current assessments and rate of school attendance.

You will find out about your child's reading age, there phonics score (Year 1 and some children in Year 2) and teacher assessments in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Ryefield uses the following codes to discuss progress and attainment:

A	Working above the expected standard for the year group
E1	Working at the expected standard for the year group
E2	Working at the expected standard for the year group but may require support from the teacher or classroom assistant
B1	Requires additional support to reach the expected standard
B2	Requires focussed support

Your child's reading age will be presented in years and month - so a child with a reading age of 10 years and 3 months will show as 10/3.

In Year 1 and Year 2 children undertake a phonics check / phonics recheck respectively. The pass mark for the test (which is undertaken in June) tends to be around a score of 32, our current assessments will inform us of how near your child is to passing and help us adapt our teaching to meet your child's needs.

We feel that by giving you this information it will better inform the discussions on how we can work together to unlock your child's potential. In advance of the March Parents' meeting we would like you to consider the following questions:

- What do you want your teachers to know about you and your child(ren)?
- What are the things that sometimes worry you about school?
- How can we better help you support your child's education at home?
- What can we do differently?
