# An amazing year

As we review the end of the 2018/2019 academic I believe it is fair to say that the school continues to go from strength to strength. At a time when teacher recruitment and retention is in crisis - Ryefield finds itself in the fortunate position of being packed with a dedicated group of professionals who are committed to ensuring **your** child is the best that they can be.



Our work on oracy continues to lead the way for local schools, for the fourth year in a row we were crowned Hillingdon champions, we remain a regular participant in the 'All London Finals' and (in the Urban Debate League) are currently ranked as one of the top 20 schools in the country.

We continue to develop a reading culture at the school - it is **the** key factor that will make a

difference in your child's education and improve their life chances. This has been achieved by giving every child in the school a book for Christmas, a vending machine rewards good attendance and 'acts of awsome-ness', and book sheds are on the playground. Parents, remember there is a hut by reception for you to take books, from September this will also include bedtime books for our children in the EYFS.

Our innovative and exciting work has caught the eye of schools locally and nationally, consequently Mr Tucker has become a director for the London Children's Book Project, and has spoken in Oxford to other schools about the work we have been doing.

All children have experienced the thrill and excitement of a school production - with our youngest performing the annual nativity, KS1's Flower Festival (a long held Ryefield tradition), and a wealth of shows and productions - including Year 6's recent performance of Romeo and Juliet which was acted in its original Shakespearean English. What a show!







A key feature of recent years has also been our enrichment work. In 2018 a dinosaur egg was discovered and all manner of adventures ensued, this year strange UFO sightings were spotted over the school. We sent a message into space and were lucky to have an alien message teleported into the school hall. Mr White has just about recovered! Who knows what next year will bring! We also had great fun encouraging our Reception pupils to embrace their inner heroes - the studio was used to produce some amazing pictures and footage which really brings a smile to one's face.
