At Ryefield we passionately believe in the importance of reading and the life changing impact it has on young peoples' lives. Reading is truly a gift and pupils should look up from the electronic glow of their mobile devices, put down their dualshock controllers, plug out of Netflix and pick up a book.

We are so passionate about reading that in February 2020, Mrs Strong is going to be testing her resilience in one of the harshest environments on the planet - the Arctic Circle - all in the name of literacy!

She is taking part in The National Literacy Trust's incredible Arctic Challenge – a series of mental and physical challenges to raise vital funds to change the life stories of



disadvantaged children in the UK. Mrs Strong will be learning new skills including dog sledding, Nordic skiing, ice fishing, and orienteering, but with temperatures reaching as low as -30 degrees centigrade and sunlight only lasting a few hours, she will be pushed to her limits!

The biggest challenge of all though, is fundraising. Please support Mrs Strong if you can. Every penny will help disadvantaged children in the UK who have little access to books or are struggling with literacy.
