After half term you will notice that the way spellings are arranged will change. The schoool will be using resources and games provided by the Spelling Shed; Year 2 - Year 6 will have weekly spellings to learn and they will be tested at school. You child will be given a sheet of spellings to LOOK, COVER, WRITE & CHECK and a quick game to help them embed and remember the spelling rule.

Furthermore some year groups will be trialling the online spelling games. This means that your child may come home with a username and password which enables them to play a range of spelling games set by their class teacher – these will link with the weekly spelling list.

Year 1 will migrate onto this system later this year – as they are consolidating key transition words.
