# Year 6 Residential 2020



For our year 6 residential trip this year we are going to Sherringham, Norfolk, for 3 nights/4 days, leaving Tuesday 23rd June returning on Friday 26th June 2020.

We have decided to change our venue and activities in preference for what we believe will offer a better residential experience for our children. The activities link more closely with the Year 6 curriculum as well as remaining fun. We will travel to Norfolk by coach leaving

Tuesday morning and return late Friday afternoon. Activities include a visit to the North Norfolk Steam Railway on an evacuee experience day, a day in Cromer with a tour of the R.N.L.I lifeboat station, crabbing, games on the beach and a visit to the pier, a boat trip from Blakeney to visit the seals on the sandspit, a trip to the local leisure pool with flumes and waves (exclusive use), pitch and putt, and evening entertainment. Accommodation will be in 5/6 bedded rooms in the Youth Hostel at Sherringham. This will be fully catered and we have exclusive occupancy.

The cost of this trip will be approximately £295\*. This amount includes the cost of all the activities, accommodation, meals and transport. A monthly payment schedule commencing November 2019 will


be organised to help spread the cost. Financial support will be available for those children who receive, or who have ever received, free school meals.

We require a deposit of £50, paid via squid, by Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November 2019. This is amount is non refundable and will be deducted from the final balance. This is another milestone in your child's development and a great way to celebrate the end of their time at Ryefield. We hope your child will be able to attend.





# Spelling Shed



After half term you will notice that the way spellings are arranged will change. The school will be using resources and games provided by the Spelling Shed; Year 2 - Year 6 will have weekly spellings to learn and they will be tested at school. You child will be given a sheet of spellings to LOOK, COVER, WRITE & CHECK and a quick game to help them embed and remember the spelling rule.

Furthermore some year groups will be trialling the online spelling games. This means that your child may come home with a username and password which enables them to play a range of spelling games set by their class teacher - these will link with the weekly spelling list.

Year 1 will migrate onto this system later this year - as they are consolidating key transition words.
