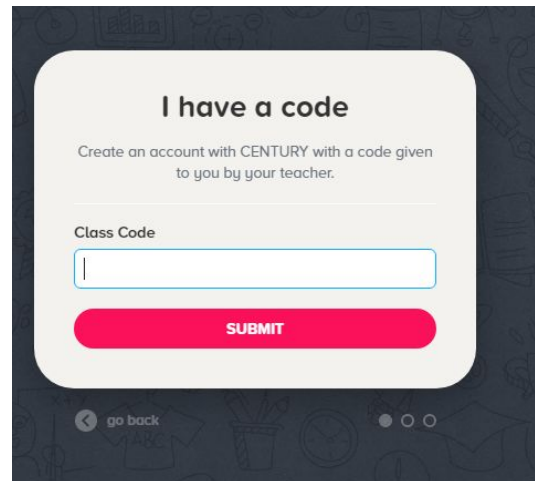
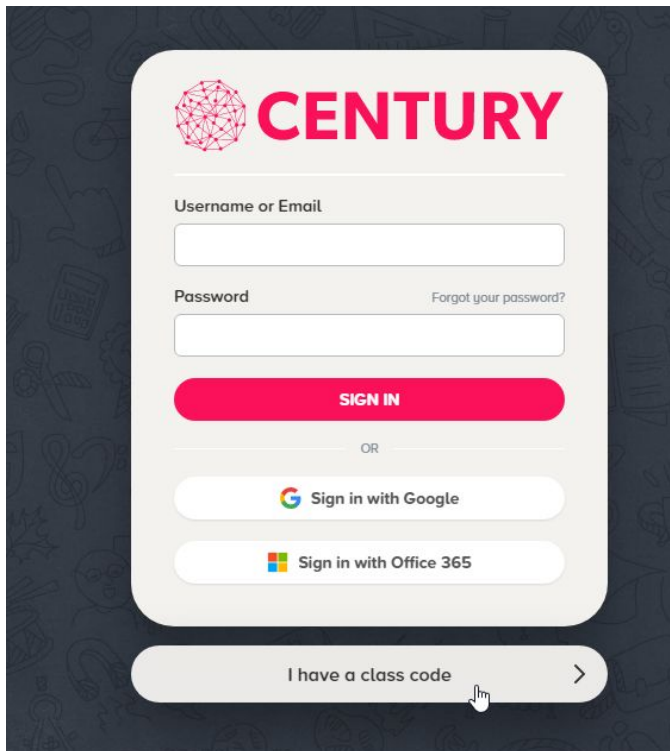

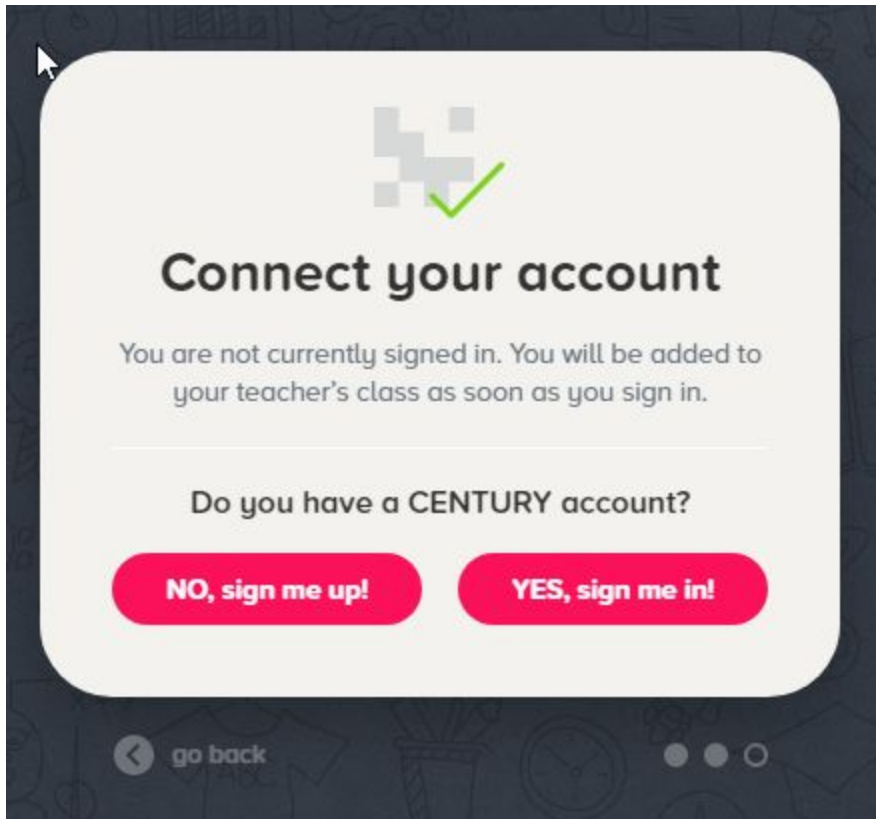

KEY WORKER UPDATE



England
