

Dear parents and carers,

I would like to express my thanks and appreciation to all who completed the questionnaire on their preferred method of communication for a virtual parents evening. The above chart shows that the majority of parents would prefer a telephone call over a meeting hosted by Google Meet. After sharing these results with the school's leadership team, it has been decided that rather than imposing our choice onto parents, we will be offering parents a choice. Where reasonably practicable, we will try to organise the telephone conversation for one evening and the Google Meetings will be set aside for the other.

I recognise that many parents may prefer to use Zoom, logistically it is easier for us to stick with Google Meet as it is linked to the teacher's Google Classroom accounts. Furthermore we have had a successful trial of this system with the induction of our Reception pupils.

I also acknowledge that some parents feel that the school should be open for face to face meetings. I am sure you can appreciate the risk that would bring to the school with regards to infection control and minimising the spread of this disease. Opening the site to the entire school community for two evenings, with parents and siblings waiting in narrow corridors would present a real risk in regards to a local spike, potentially resulting in multiple closures of classes.

The school is working hard to ensure that parents do not feel that they are being kept at arms length, although the 2m rule does still apply! Should you ever have concerns about your child's progress or require clarification on a teaching point, then please contact your child's teacher via the school office.





Hot Lunches

The school's expansion of its hot meal service, dubbed 'DeliveRye' continues to be a success with pupils. We are expanding the hot meal options to include pasta pots, pizza with garlic bread, and we are pleased to introduce a Friday favourite: **fish and chips!**

The school kitchen is providing packed lunches for all pupils who are eligible for free school meals, this includes children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2. We have limited spaces in our after school clubs.
