Polite Reminder to Parents

Late pick-ups

Please could we remind the small minority of parents who pick their children up late that this can cause the children to be upset and places an undue burden on staff. School pick up times are:

Reception & KS1	3.15pm
KS2	3.20pm

If your child is not collected by 3.40pm they will be placed in our After School Club and the family charged (including a late booking fee). This is so that we can ensure your child is safe, properly supervised and safeguarded.

Appointments

If your child has an appointment during school hours, please send a copy of the appointment letter in to school in advance. If we have not been made aware in advance, there may be a delay in locating your child – they could be in PE or other lessons not held in the usual classroom.

Bicycles

Please could we remind everyone that children should not be riding bicycles on the school premises.



If you have any empty ink cartridges or old mobile phones we have a collection point in the office for them. All items collected will be recycled to provide funds for the Dogs Trust Charity.

Be prepared for warm weather!

We would like to remind you of a few school rules relating to the warmer weather.

- Please ensure you apply sunscreen to your child before they come to school to protect them throughout the day.
- Please supply your child with a sunhat and appropriate uniform for the weather.
- Children should bring a bottle of water to school to keep them hydrated during the day. (Children have access to water in class and at lunch as well as the water fountains around school)
- Sunglasses should not be worn unless they are prescription or for medical reasons.
- If your child suffers from hayfever please ensure they take their medication before school so to last them throughout the day.
