#### Supporting Children Through Transition – Summer Term 2025

We understand how important it is for children to feel confident and secure as they prepare to move into their new year groups in September. To support this, we have developed a carefully sequenced transition programme throughout the second half of the summer term, designed to reduce anxiety and build familiarity.

**Week commencing 9 June**: Each class will generate a list of questions about their new year group. These may cover topics like routines, expectations, or the physical environment. Teachers will gather these during class discussions, and keep them ready for the following week.

Staff will also meet as part of our INSET day to share key information and ensure continuity.

**Week commencing 23 June**: Children will tour their new year group areas, including classrooms, cloakrooms and toilets. Teachers will also share with families which class and teacher their child will have in September.

**Tuesday 1 July (Week 4)**: Our official 'Transition Morning' will take place. Children will spend time in their new classrooms with their new teacher, followed by a whole school playtime using their new playground areas. Pupils will also hear from children currently in the year group they are moving into, as part of a 'pupil voice' activity.

Weeks beginning 7 and 14 July: Additional transition activities will take place where needed, including more visits and teacher interactions. Children with SEND will receive tailored support through ongoing transition sessions and individual planning led by Miss Lansiquot and the Hub team.

We're committed to making transition a positive and supportive experience for every child at Ryefield.

As part of our transition planning, we also take great care when forming classes for the new academic year. Each year, we review the makeup of year group cohorts to ensure that classes are balanced in terms of academic ability, social and emotional characteristics, and gender. This is essential to create a fair and positive learning environment for all pupils. We recognise that children thrive when they are in classrooms that support both their learning and wellbeing. To achieve this, we sometimes need to remix classes within the year group. These decisions are not taken lightly. They are made in consultation with current class teachers, senior leaders, and—in the case of SEND pupils—the Inclusion Team, to ensure that every child's needs are considered.

To support this process, friendship pairs have been taken into consideration, and we will do our very best to ensure that each child has at least one familiar friend with them. We aim to ensure a smooth and successful transition into well-balanced, inclusive and supportive classes where every child can flourish socially and academically.
