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End of year assessments



As we approach the final term of the school year, children across the school will be taking part in important end-of-year assessments. These national assessments help teachers and school leaders understand how well children are progressing and where further support may be needed. Here's a brief overview of what's coming up and how you can help at home.

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

This check takes place during the week beginning Monday 9th June. It is a short, one-to-one assessment where children are asked to read a series of real and 'nonsense' words aloud. It helps us see how well children are learning to decode using phonics – a vital skill for early reading.

How you can help:

- Read regularly with your child and encourage them to sound out unfamiliar words.
- Play phonics games such as "What's the alien word?" using simple made-up words.
- Focus on building confidence this is a low-pressure activity for the child and is

Year 4 Multiplication Tables Check (MTC)

Children in Year 4 will complete the Multiplication Tables Check in June. This is an online test of 25 questions, with just 6 seconds to answer each one. The aim is to ensure children have quick recall of all times tables up to 12 x 12.

How you can help:

- Practise times tables regularly in short, fun bursts (e.g. during car journeys or while getting ready in the morning).
- Use free online tools like Hit the Button or Times Tables Rock Stars.
- Keep it positive a few minutes a day can make a big difference.

Year 6 End of Key Stage 2 SATs

SATs week for Year 6 pupils begins on Monday 12th May. Children will sit tests in grammar, punctuation and spelling (GPS), reading, and maths. These tests assess what pupils have learnt during Key Stage 2 and are used to inform secondary schools of your child's academic level.

How you can help:

- Ensure your child gets plenty of sleep and eats a healthy breakfast during SATs week.
- Encourage them to talk about any worries they may have reassure them that all we ask is for them to try their best.
- Continue reading with them and discussing texts to build their comprehension skills.
- Help them stay calm with lots of encouragement and praise.

While these assessments are important, they are just one part of the picture. At Ryefield Primary, we value the whole child – their effort, their attitude, their creativity and kindness. These qualities matter just as much as test scores.
